Only five meetings, and a

little soul searching, and a group of dedicated people got together in Wingham to become the Governing body of the THE BARN DANCE HALL OF FAME HISTORICAL

FOUNDATION. The headquarters to be within the community of Wingham, Ontario, Canada.

There was now an organization, a Board of Directors, but NO MONEY.

The golden opportunity of officially introducing the idea of creating a BARN DANCE HALL OF FAME and Entertainment centre of the Arts was now under way.

It surely must have been the Luck of the Irish the Foundation was able to obtain a booth at the International Plowing Match held at Walkerton, Ontario in September of 1993. Had it not been for the generosity of the Bruce County Plowmens Association, a major fund raising opportunity may never have happened. The Match proved to be a great success for our organization.

During the five day chain of events at the Plowing Match, THE BARN DANCE HALL OF FAME exhibit became a most outstanding attraction. Throngs of visitors commuting with our co-workers made their message LOUD AND CLEAR, they were supporting the idea for this worthy cause, and they did so in great numbers. More than four thousand tickets were sold on a draw. To achieve the honour of becoming an Official Founding Member of the organization, many also made a further contribution by joining the Barn Dance Friendship

Club. The response was tremendous and more and more members are joining by the day. Contributions were received from donors from all parts of Ontario, every Province across Canada, the states of Michigan, Ohio, and New York. as well as the British Isles and Australia.

A special mention must be given to the people that manned the booth throughout the five day event, Earl and Martha Heywood, Muriel Grummet, Gail Holmes and Donna Cornwall.

The members of the Bruce County Plowmans Association are to be highly commended for having the foresight of gathering all the local talent available within the county to present to the International show. Evidently the results were certainly not in vain, for seven mile of midway came alive with music and entertainment. Brass bands, Kiltie bands, choirs, Rock and Roll music Blue Grass and Country and Western music along with variety acts entertained the visitors daily. There must have been several hundred performers together with the Memorabilia Show of "CANADA'S LARGEST TRAVELLING BARN DANCE" making it one of the most popular and spectacular attractions ever staged at the International Plowing Match.

Our Barn Dance Historical Foundation hopes to come up with pictures of some of the performers to create a memorable, historical show piece to add to the Barn Dance Hall of Fame collection.

Spreading the Word

The popular University of Toronto CTIV-FM radio station covering the greater Metropolitan area of the Golden Horseshoe conducted a one hour broadcast Monday evening, November 29th, 1993 featuring Steve Fruitman with Earl Heywood as his guest.

The University of Toronto station has been playing a major role in promoting live performers, and informing their listeners of what's new in Canadian country music. The University of Toronto Press, another division within the campus, recently published Volume 2 of the Encyclopedia of music in Canada, with distribution

throughout the United Kingdom,
Canada and the United States. The
1500 page hard cover book included the
history of a number of the most famous
Canadian Country artists who got their
start on the Wingham Radio station.
The book included a lengthy but
incredible story of the original Barn
Dance founded by the late W.T. "Doc"
Cruikshank in 1937 that became the
longest live radio show of it's kind in the
history of Canadian broadcasting.

It so happened a director from the University of Toronto Radio Station, attending the International Plowing match held in Walkerton in September Of "93, came across the BARN DANCE HALL OF FAME exhibit. He was so impressed with the showcase of the BARN DANCE memorabilia that he invited Earl Heywood to appear in a radio interview that covered his backgrounds and the story of his concept for the BARN DANCE HALL OF FAME.

Throughout the interview Earl entertained listeners with songs, while Steve reminded listeners they could be kept informed about the HALL OF FAME project, its forth coming events and attractions, by joining the BARN DANCE FRIENDSHIP CLUB.

Earl Heywood has been invited to make a second appearance on CTIV-FM in Toronto for an update sometime in April.

Ernie King's Store Changes Hands

Ernie King Music has been under new ownership since October 1, but it's still business as usual at the Josephine street location in Wingham. In fact the new owner says the business has expanded.

Dave Wallace said Ernie King Music has provided sales and service for many years. However, He added service is getting as busy as is the sales part of the business.

Dave and Marie Wallace have taken over the retail end of the business with Ernie and Darlene King looking after service under the name E-K Repairs.

The sound studio, operating under the name Renaissance Sound, and owned by Mark Hussey and Wayne Taylor will offer 24- track digital recording capabilities.

Wallace said the owners of the studio hope to be recording by the end of the month and will be able to record everything from local artists' demo tapes to a full album. They eventually hope to attract artists from outside the midwestern Ontario area.

They hope to provide the big city recording quality with the small town atmosphere.

A musician for 30 years in the Wellington County area, Wallace bought a guitar from Ernie about 10 years ago.

"I knew Ernie by reputation from his playing on the Circle- 8 Ranch show for many years," said Wallace.

Wallace has talked many times with Ernie about who Ernie King really is and what the business was all about. He was also able to indicate his interest about getting involved in the retail business.

"I don't think I could've found a finer couple than Ernie and Darlene King to do business with," said Wallace.

He invites both old and new customers to come in and say hello. Ernie King will still be involved in the store in Wingham, working two days per week-Mondays and Wednesdays.

Wallace said he will be opening a second Ernie King Music 1993 Ltd. store in Goderich at 34 Newgate Ave. He pointed out that both stores will sell everything from acoustic guitars to amplifiers and P.A. systems. They will also be selling electric keyboards, records, tapes, drums and sheet music.

However, he noted that all the major repairs will be done by Ernie King in Wingham.

Wallace said he will do everything possible to make sure that the customer leaves his store a satisfied customer, whether with the right piece of equipment or satisfied with the repairs.

"We guarantee all of our work," he said.

Ernie King would like his friends to know that he is devoting more of his time to the HALL OF FAME PROJECT. He has gathered up an extensive collection of antique and rare instruments that will be the centre of a
